Exhibition: **Egyptian Mummies: Exploring Ancient Lives**

Egyptian Mummies: Exploring Ancient Lives - The British Museum production reconstructs the lives of six individuals who lived along the Nile from about 900 BC to AD 180. Using an innovative approach combining art and cutting-edge technology, it paints a picture of who these people were. Together with 3D digital images, interactive visual display units and more than 200 items from the British Museum's renowned Egyptian collection, these encounters will offer a unique view of the way in which people lived and died in this period of history. The presentation of this exhibition is a collaboration between the British Museum and the MMFA.
